Confirmation Programme 2019

Parents with children who have been baptised and who have celebrated first confession are welcome to register their children from next weekend for the Confirmation programme. Timelines will be distributed.

During the programme, parents are required to have a presence at Mass with their children. Parents are encouraged to invest seriously in the programme by also bringing their children to the Sacrament of Penance on a Saturday mornings from 9:30 AM to 10:10 AM.

If over the course of the programme there are children who are not feeling 100% on the Saturday evening or Sunday morning, please wait until Sunday evening before attending Mass without them. Children may be a little off-colour in the morning but may well improve over the day.
