Please be extra mindful of the rehearsal times for all the confirmation ceremonies. It is at these rehearsals that pews are allocated to candidates and their families.

It's with a little sadness that Bishop Brian will be unable to be the celebrant for our ceremonies this year. His presence is required in Rome with other Australian Bishops for the five yearly Ad Limina Apostolorum, generally abbreviated as the ad limina. It translates as "To the Threshold of the Apostles".
