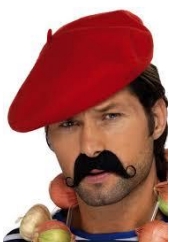
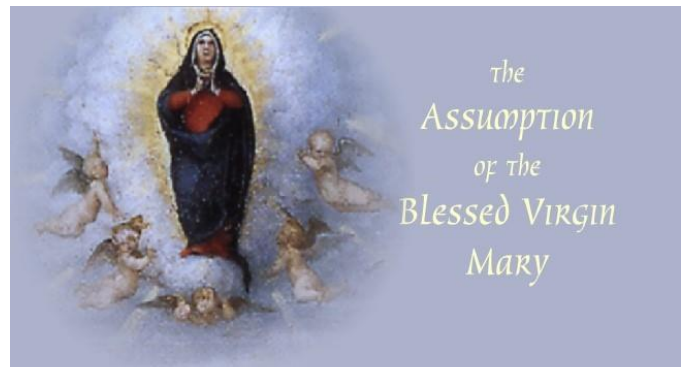
Upcoming Cursillo Weekend
