The Oaks ~ Meeting 29th September 2022

A summary of this meeting – in the form of a document – has now been prepared. There had been intentions for the document to be circulated after Masses this weekend at Oakdale and The Oaks.

However, because of the sensitivity of the content and the inclusion of names – and to avoid any kind of hurt or harm to all people concerned – a decision has since been taken to file the document and to provide a copy to Bishop Brian for the sole purpose of requesting permission to sell the parcel of land adjoining the cemetery and zoned RU2.

Parishioners from The Oaks are welcome to contact myself to discuss the matter but the document needs to remain confidential. Even though there can be sharp differences during times of discussion, the good name and reputation of all people need to be preserved as far as possible.

Covid Update

Remaining restrictions that have applied in our own diocese over the past few years are expected to be lifted by the end of the month. At this time, holy water will be once again available to parishioners and visitors as they enter the church.

However, we now need to have the holy water changed regularly. A good idea is that after a few days of use, the holy water is tipped upon one of our lovely gardens, with containers then refilled.

Parish Pastoral Council

After a few years of hibernation, our PPC will soon be revived. The work of the PPC is to discuss and support various pastoral initiatives, and to share ideas that help to bring greater vitality to parish life.

Mass Counts in November

So we need to comply. Will probably try to ask for eight volunteers for each Mass with each volunteer counting and recording the number of people at the Offertory in a particular block of pews. Should all be quite painless.

Clergy and people with leadership positions within the church are obliged to undertake various courses for professional development throughout the year.

St Clare's New Church

Quite a useful meeting transpired on Wednesday 5 October. Those present have now been commissioned to tour various websites to consider architectural styles. The next meeting has been scheduled for 26th October at 7:00 PM in the meeting room at St Clare's.

Heritage Hall

The HH hall is currently without a floor. The timber in the previous floor buckled some months ago because of water and dampness. The delay in constructing another timber floor is due to mysterious drainage complications that still need to be unraveled.

However, the whole process is underway. Need to be patient. Eventually, the HH will return to have the beautiful interior it deserves. Landscaping is also a work-in-progress. Tall trees needed to be removed because falling leaves and needles were cluttering the gutters. 'Will all look quite lovely when completed.

Would You Believe? But it's true!

This Sunday, another eight infants will be baptised, bringing the total number to 401 for the year. Huge.

So, the question is whether the 500 benchmark will be reached? Generally, there are eight baptisms each week and after this Sunday there'll still be 10 Sundays available.

There are no baptisms on the 21 Novembers because of FHC. But there are also some adults to be baptised from our Catholic enrichment programme which is now in full swing. And there are occasions when baptisms are celebrated on a Friday evening. Could be close!

First Holy Communion Programme


Big weekend with the distribution of books according to a two-step process. (1) An A5 form will need to be collected by candidates at some time through Mass. The candidates' names need to be filled in. (2) The forms are then brought to the attendants in the parish meeting room and exchanged for the workbooks and assistance sheet at the conclusion of Mass.

From the books during the coming week, parents need to complete their own reading on page 3, and assist their children to complete all the activities in the first chapter (pages 4-8). The time allocated ought to be about an hour BUT it shouldn't cause any suffering.

Between now and the day of First Holy Communion, parents/carers should also bring their children to confession. Parish confession times are Saturday mornings from 9:30 AM to 10:15 AM. The children should receive assistance in preparing their consciences and also advised of the length of time since their most recent confession.
