The Old St Thomas Chapel, Narellan

Many parishioners would be aware of the Old St Thomas Chapel, Narellan. Looking from Camden Valley Way, it's positioned just behind the police station.

The chapel is <u>NOT</u> Catholic and has no connection with our own parish. Please be mindful of the following:

Weddings

It is possible to have a Catholic wedding at St Thomas but such weddings are rare and not encouraged. The reason is that people of the Catholic faith are generally required to be married in the Catholic Church. In our own parish, weddings are celebrated in the parish church at Camden or at Mater Dei.

However, it is possible to apply for a dispensation and, if granted, means that a wedding can also take place outside of a Catholic Church, say in a park or a reception venue or an ecumenical chapel. Once again, the wedding would presume to have a presider who's a Catholic minister (bishop, priest or deacon).

outside Catholic churches and chapels. So even if a dispensation is granted, it may be virtually impossible to find a priest to preside.

In church law, it's also even possible for a Catholic to apply for a dispensation from a Catholic ceremony. So, for example, if a Catholic man and an Anglican woman are engaged, and if the man doesn't have any interest in church but the woman is deeply committed to her own church, then an application for dispensation from being married in the Catholic Church could be submitted and granted. Generally, the main condition is that there's agreement to baptise children in the Catholic Church.

Baptisms

Church law requires baptisms to be celebrated in the parish church unless there's a dispensation from the bishop. Accordingly, there's the very strong presumption that there will be no baptisms in The Old St Thomas Chapel according to 'The Rites of the Catholic Church'. The website for the St Thomas chapel states that Catholic Baptisms are able to take place. This is false.

Please be aware that there's a 'denomination' which includes the term 'catholic'. Please don't be fooled.

If a mum and dad have their baby baptised in this chapel by an ecumenical minister, it is NOT a baptism in the Catholic Church and will NOT be included in St Paul's baptism register. And the baby will NOT be Catholic.

Furthermore, the baby, upon reaching an age for enrolment into kindergarten into one of our Catholic primary schools, would have little or no prospects for success. The babies who have been baptised in St Paul's church would have the first priority, followed by those baptised in other parish churches. In addition, upon reaching the age they SHOULD be eligible for sacramental programmes, again they would be considered NOT baptised Catholic.

It's definitely worth being mindful that the total number of baptisms at St Paul's this year will be very close to 500. The yearly intake for kindergarten places at St Clare's and St Paul's is 180 together. Babies who are baptised at The Old St Thomas Chapel by an ecumenical minister really have no chance at all.

Covid Update

Extract from Most Reverend Brian Mascord, Bishop of Wollongong:

Now that the authorities have removed restrictions, it is appropriate to revoke diocesan restrictions:

Holy Day Dispensation

Commencing the weekend of 29/30 October 2022, the obligation to attend Holy Mass and Holy Days of Obligation will be reinstated. However, out of proper self-care and responsible love for their fellow worshippers, the faithful should not attend Mass or gatherings when ill.

Receiving the Eucharist "on the tongue"

Pastors may commence administering Communion on the tongue. However (writes Father Michael), in our own parish only the priest will distribute communion in this manner. Those wanting to receive communion on the tongue should be positioned towards the end of the communion line.

Holy Water stoups

The stoups will now be filled. Water will be changed regularly. When no longer required, the water will be tipped onto our garden.

Our emerging council will be 'breaking new ground' as it will be open to parishioners from both parishes.

November Mass Offerings

Parishioners are advised that all Masses – weekend and midweek – are offered for the repose of the Holy Souls in November. Specifically, the Masses will be offered for the deceased family members and friends of parishioners from Camden and The Oaks

There are specially designated envelopes for the standard offering of \$20, an amount that was determined by the Australian Bishops Conference about 10 years ago. Alternatively, the option is available to simply use an envelope and write the name(s) of the deceased person(s) on the outside. The names will be recorded together in the form of a document and then framed and positioned in front of the altar.

Offerings can be dropped into any of the collection bags at Mass or delivered to the parish office during opening hours.

Mass Counts in November

Reminder that as a diocesan requirement, the Mass count will need to apply for three of the four weekends at all Masses in November. The weekend of First Holy Communion on 20/21 will be omitted. You might be tapped on the shoulder to count at one of the Masses.
