Sacrament of Penance Programme 2022/2023

Families with children who have been baptised, and in Year 2 and be going into at least Year 3 in 2023 at school or higher, are invited to enrol in the Sacrament of Penance Programme over the weekend of 26th/27th November.

The various requirements of the programme are not demanding but do include a commitment to Mass. If families – especially children – have an aversion to Mass, please do NOT enrol.

It's much better to wait – possibly even years if necessary – until parents and children are committed to a process of genuine formation.

For families who truly value the life-giving experience of Holy Mass, the Penance Programme promises to be wonderfully rewarding.

Adult Initiation

This Saturday morning 12 November at 10:00 AM, 15 adults will be fully initiated into the Catholic Church. For seven of the adults, the process will include baptism. For the entire 15, the initiation will also include Confirmation and FHC.

Everyone has a spiritual pathway that includes many unique experiences. For those baptised into the Catholic Church, the opportunity for spiritual strengthening and renewal is always available through Word and Sacrament. So important.

Our prayerful support reaches out to the adults soon to be fully initiated.

Notwithstanding some measure of disappointment, it's important to remain positive and reflect upon the majority of families that were seriously committed, motivated, and prepared to make sacrifice to meet the programme requirements. Lots of families did a great job.

BTW, last weekend there were 17 adults who returned books without the children at Mass. It was explained that they were sick. Must surely have been a nasty little bug in circulation.

'Would be prepared to bet a \$100, however, that on the weekend of First Holy Communions, the nasty little bug will be dead and buried, and almost all those who were too sick to be at Mass last weekend will have recovered to be enjoying the fullness of health and vitality. Just a hunch!

Contingency plans are now under consideration for another FHC ceremony in mid-January for those who have not handed in their books and, therefore, not completed the requirements of the programme.

Books assessed as worthy will have been stamped on the inside of the front cover, and can be collected by the children this weekend after Masses.
