## First Sunday of Advent ~ Year A

## **Sacrament of Penance Programme 2022/2023**

Enrolment opportunity on this weekend of 26<sup>th</sup> / 27<sup>th</sup> November. Children need to have been baptised and in at least Year 2 at school.

The programme (1) requires the participation of parents/carers with their children. And (2) provides a unique opportunity for personal conversion. Humility of heart is an indispensable quality.

All intending to enrol must be committed and motivated, and without any kind of aversion to Mass.

Forms will be distributed at the conclusion of Mass, to be clearly filled in with your child's name. This form is then exchanged for a timeline. Timelines should be placed in a clearly visible location at home for families to follow.

### **First Holy Communions**

Congratulations are extended to the 180 children who received their First Holy Communion last weekend 19/20 November, in four Masses spread over the two days.

Gratitude is extended to our parish secretaries. 'Takes a long time to hand-feed every certificate individually". Musicians, vocalists and choristers all excelled again. Our adult servers – who also assist as sacristans – were highly reliable, dedicated and competent. A number of teachers provided logistical support. All needed and all very much appreciated.

And – in terms the reverent and proper manner of receiving Holy Communion on the hand – the FHC children progressed quite remarkably from the time of the rehearsal to the actual celebration. It was very apparent that parents and carers had done a wonderful job during the interim. Was all so very special.

After the 9.00am Mass on Thursdays for the period of Advent, there will be a group of parishioners participating in an Advent programme.
