# **Pope Francis on Advent**

At the beginning of Advent, Pope Francis remarked: "Advent is the season for remembering the closeness of God who came down to dwell in our midst,"

"Let us make the traditional Advent prayer our own: 'Come, Lord Jesus.'

We can say it at the beginning of each day and repeat it often, before our meetings, our studies, and our work, before making decisions, in every important or difficult moment of our lives: 'Come, Lord Jesus,'

Pope Francis stressed that Advent is both a time of "God's closeness and our watchfulness".

"It is important to remain watchful, because one great mistake in life is to get absorbed in a thousand things and not to notice God".

Saint Augustine said: 'Timeo Iesum Transeuntem' (I fear that Jesus will pass by me unnoticed). Drawn by our own interests ... and distracted by so many vein things, we risk losing sight of what is essential.

Pope Francis warned of the dangers of mediocrity, lukewarmness, and indifference in the Christian life.

"Without making an effort to love God daily and awaiting the newness he constantly brings, we become mediocre, lukewarm, worldly. And this slowly eats away at our faith, for faith is the very opposite of mediocrity: It is ardent desire for God, a bold effort to change, the courage to love, constant progress,"

Pope Francis said that prayer and charity are antidotes to mediocrity and indifference.

"Charity is the beating heart of the Christian: just as one cannot live without a heartbeat, so one cannot be a Christian without charity".

#### **Comments on Christmas Parties by Greg Sheridan**

Who is Greg Sheridan? He is the foreign editor for The Australian' Newspaper. His most recent book, "Christians, the urgent case for Jesus in our world", became a best seller weeks after publication.

He is one of the nation's most influential national security commentators, who is active across television and radio, and also writes extensively on culture and religion. He has written eight books, mostly on Asia and international relations. A previous book, "God is Good for You" was also a best seller.

On a personal level, he acknowledges that he drank too much alcohol in his 20s and has long since given-up altogether.

Earlier this week, he was engaged in a conversation with Andrew Bolt who hosts an hourly current affairs programme on SKY TV at 7:00 PM Mondays to Thursdays. A big part of the conversation related to Christmas parties. The following are various extracts from Sheridan:

I don't attend Christmas parties because they're a place of danger...the vast majority of Australians go to Christmas parties and nothing bad happens.

The problem is the fetish of alcohol. Given the massive damage that booze does to our country and to human lives time after time, why don't office parties have a 'no booze' policy.

When you go out to celebrate with your workmates and your bosses and your subordinates, men and women,.....whose ever been to be Christmas party when at least somebody doesn't get drunk?

And getting drunk is a really bad, stupid, dangerous, unhealthy, vicious, nasty, retrograde, anti-human thing to do.

At 'booze-free' Christmas parties, more people will keep their careers and fewer people will die on the roads from coming home from Christmas parties.

Not everyone will agree with Sheridan but he does have a point.

Fortunately, at our own end-of-year Christmas socials in the Catholic schools in our parish, along with other parish Christmas socials, people have <u>not</u> been known to get drunk and ruin their careers.
