Sacrament of Penance Programme 2022/2023

At this stage there are over 150 children who have been enrolled in the programme, the very large and overwhelming majority were at Mass last weekend to collect the holy card with the Act of Contrition. Thank you. This most important penitential prayer needs to be known perfectly by children and their parents.

Those who have not collected the card will be presumed to have been withdrawn from the programme by their parents if away again this weekend.

The books, personalised with the children's names, will be distributed this weekend along with notes for parents to help them more easily assist their children work through the activity sheets.

Heritage Hall

The Engineer's Report has been received. The recommendations are now under consideration.

St Aloysius, The Oaks

A commercial real estate agent has now been appointed to advance those plans that were formulated in 2022 by our local community towards ensuring the financial vitality of the parish. Earlier, these plans had been submitted to Bishop Brian Mascord and were subsequently approved.

The strategic plan is to develop an income stream for restoration work on the five buildings in the parish.

Accordingly, a meeting has been scheduled at The Oaks for Thursday 2 March at 6:00 PM to discuss the latest developments. The meeting is intended for parishioners from The Oaks who are current contributors to parish finances.

St Clare's Church

An architect is expected to be appointed in coming days. A contract will be negotiated. Design work will then begin asap.

Any Ideas?

At St Paul's there's an older chalice and an old 'asperges bowl' and an 'aspergillum'.

Translation: An asperges bowl is a brass holy water bowl.

An aspergillum is the brass handpiece that's used to throw holy water about, especially at times like Palm Sunday to bless the palms. Need to have a long range.

A new asperges bowl and aspergillum have been purchased though not as large as the originals. The original aspergillum is in good condition plus we also have another reasonably new one.

Question One: Do we pay for the professional restoration of the asperges bowl which has been quoted

at \$1,210. This would provide a back-up set that could always be used in St Clare's new church or vici versa.

Question Two: Do we pay for the restoration of the chalice which has been quoted as \$2,200?

The work involves chemical clean, scratch brush, remove dents, straighten, reshape,

other necessary work, gold inside, light external polish.

The work would be undertaken by WJ Sanders who a few years ago restored one of our chalices very beautifully. On the occasion of St Paul's 150th Anniversary in 2009, this particular chalice was purchased by our four schools – St Paul's, Mater Dei, St Clare's and Magdalene – with each school chipping in a \$1,000.

The chalice is very beautiful but, after continuous use at Mass for about eight years, it began to fade. The restoration of the \$4,000 chalice was most worthwhile.

WJ Sanders also manufactures the Melbourne Cup which is awarded every year on the first Tuesday in November.

So we now have another chalice that has been removed from circulation because it's so discoloured. It's probably been in the parish for 100 years. As a matter of interest, the purchase price of a new chalice locally will range from \$1,400 for the cheapies to \$7,000 for sterling silver, so \$2,200 to restore this beautiful chalice seems reasonable.
