St Ignatius of Loyola

Born in 1491 at Loyola in northern Spain, his early adult life was in the army. But he later converted to a life of holiness. He studied theology at Paris and gathered companions around him. Afterwards in Rome, he formed the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). He was an enormous contributor to the reform of the church. He died in 1556

But he did share a useful insight with this quote:

"The trouble with the world is that fools and fanatics are always so sure of themselves while wiser men are full of doubts".

In case you missed it ~ Receiving Holy Communion

Holy Communion should always be received with great reverence. Regardless of age – and if receiving HC on the hand – the following procedure is intended to assist all our parishioners:

- 1. Hands should be rather flat and pointing in a mostly forward direction.
- 2. Thumbs should be pointing in the same direction as the fingers, and not poking out at near 90 degrees.
- 3. Upon receiving the host and in response to the words "*The Body of Christ*" the communicant answers "*Amen*", and then without turning takes one step and only one step to the side.
- 4. The lower hand comes from underneath to gently hold the host and place it in one's mouth.
- 5. The practice of lifting both hands to the mouth and consuming the host from the palm of the upper hand as if to swallow a bunch of peanuts is far short of the reverence required.
