Saint Teresa of Jesus doctor.

Sacrament of First Holy Communion

The First Holy Communion programme recommences this weekend after the school holiday break. On Thursday evening the first workshop of the video series by Bishop Robert Barron called "The Mass" was held in the Heritage Hall lead by Father James. Thirty-nine Parishioners attended; the workshops will continue each Thursday evening from 7.00pm until 8.00pm until 14 November. The first workshop was very well received, it was titled A Privileged Encounter and explored the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. There was lively discussion after the presentation with everyone joining in. A cup of tea or coffee was then enjoyed and the conversation continued. A wonderful start to the evenings, parishioners are still welcome to come along, it is not too late to join the workshops, so if you would like to know more about how and why things happen during Mass please contact the Parish office to register.

So how does a silent auction work?

Each item (or set of items) of furniture has a clipboard containing the name of the item. A reserve price will be placed underneath.

A little further down the page, there is an opportunity for interested bidders to write their names, contact details and a higher bid. This process will apply over three hours. It will only be extended beyond 12 midday if a bidding is still competitive.

Items include chairs, tables, lounges, wardrobes, cabinets,... Some are slightly damaged and others are slightly marked. But there are no refunds, no arbitration, no 'ifs and buts'.

Most items will be in the hall, but there may be other items in the double garage on the southern side of the presbytery.

Advent Event ~ Saturday Evening 30 November ~ Advance Notice

Shouldn't be too much longer before the shops are adorned with Christmas advertising.

In seven weeks' time, the Church will be celebrating the First Sunday of Advent. For quite a few years, the parish marked this occasion by having an **Advent Event**. This occasion on our social calendar was suspended for a few years after the hall was affected by heavy rain that resulted in a need to replace the floor. It was a painfully protracted process and quite a drama. Still very thankful to our parishioners who assisted in the repair work. Quite specialised.

So at our **Advent Event**, participants would have a presence at the 5:00 PM Vigil Mass, and then gather afterwards in the Heritage Hall for a meal. Maximum of 90.

There's time for a pre-dinner drink, and the meal begins to be served from about 6:30 PM. As a feature, there's two specially designated discussion topics chosen by the parish priest. Each table appoints a leader so as to provide feedback to the whole gathering at the appointed time.

The proceedings are very polite and civilised. There's no loud music, no shouting, no thumping on the tables and no throwing of food.

The evening generally comes to a close about 8:00 PM but participants often stay until about 8:30 PM.

The cost is just \$20/person and includes a two-course meal, beverages and tea/coffee. One of our parishioners will be appointed as the MC to ensure that the evening flows freely. Always a great night.

If interested, please register at the parish office – either in person or by phone. It is possible to nominate other parishioners with whom you would like to be seated. And all participants will be appointed to a table. Another wonderful evening is assured.
