Spiritual Insight about Happiness

Aristotle (c. 384 B.C. to 322 B.C.) was an Ancient Greek philosopher and scientist who is still considered one of the greatest thinkers in politics, psychology and ethics.

A key component of Aristotle's theory of happiness is the factor of virtue. He contended that in aiming for happiness, the most important factor is to have 'complete virtue' or – in other words – good moral character. Aristotle also adds that other experiences of good fortune can also contribute to happiness.

In the Christian faith, the experience of happiness includes a life of virtue but goes much further. We are called by God to know, to love and to serve him. We are called to be "partakers of divine nature" and to enter into the glory of Christ.

Accordingly, the path of discipleship invites us to purify our hearts of bad instincts and to seek the love of God above all else. Our faith teaches that true happiness is not found in riches or well-being, in human fame or power, or in any human achievement. True happiness is found in God alone, the source of every good and of all love.
