# **Spiritual Insight**

This coming Wednesday is 11 November. Two reasons to be mindful of this date:

At 11 am on 11 November 1918 the guns on the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare. The allied armies had driven the German invaders back, having inflicted heavy defeats upon them over the preceding four months. In November the Germans called for an armistice (suspension of fighting) in order to secure a peace settlement. They accepted allied terms that amounted to unconditional surrender.

The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years. The allied nations chose this day and time for the commemoration of their war dead.

The 11<sup>th</sup> November is also the Feast day of Martin of Tours. He was born of pagan parents about 316. He received baptism and gave up his career as a soldier and founded a monastery in France where he lived the religious life. He was ordained as bishop of Tours, giving example of a good shepherd, establishing new monasteries, instructing the clergy and preaching the Gospel. He had a special devotion to the poor.

When he was dying there were priests gathered round his bed. The room was heavy with emotion. At one time, the priests wished to turn him over to ease his poor body but he stopped them 'Brothers, let me go on looking at heaven, not at the earth; my soul will be pointing to God when its moment of departure comes'.

He then had a vision of the devil standing near and cried out: 'Blood-stained beast, what are you doing here? You will find nothing of yours in me, you living death. I go to the arms of Abraham'.

These were his last words. Then he surrendered his soul to God. Martin, who was poor and humble, goes into heaven a wealthy man.

## **Confirmation Programme**

Congratulations are extended to the many families whose sons and daughters celebrated their Confirmation last weekend. All the planning progressed wonderfully well except for the electrical blackout at the 2:00 PM Mass. The lights and PA system shut down during the First Reading and automatically returned at the Offertory. Can only hope that our families were still able to hear Father Joseph's homily.
