## Easter Triduum Ceremonies ~ Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday

Registrations for all our solemn ceremonies will be available from <u>Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> March at 9:00 AM</u> The Covid restrictions still apply.

Please note the following:

Palm Sunday: All ceremonies are to be within the parish church.

Holy Thursday Washing of the feet is to be omitted. The final procession from the church at the end

of Mass is also omitted. The Blessed Sacrament will be retained in the tabernacle in

the church; parishioners may remain in prayer until 9:00 PM.

Good Friday The adoration of the cross by kissing shall be limited solely to the celebrant. The

faithful may approach the cross and bow but are not permitted to touch it.

Easter Vigil The Vigil is to be celebrated only in the cathedral and parish churches. The sprinkling

rite is omitted.

Please be mindful that if parents and carers would like to have their children celebrate the Sacrament of Penance in a more conversive way, then please come to the chapel on Saturday mornings from 9:30 AM to 10 AM. Could be a good idea for the adult to speak to the priest for a brief moment before hand.

The manner of confession would be for the little son or daughter to sit opposite the priest. The confessional door would remain open and the child would remain at all times in a line of sight to the parent/carer.
